What to Expect After Ileostomy Closure Surgery

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Yo	ur H	ospital Stay: ApproximatelyDays. The exact number of days will be decided by your surgeon after
su	rger	y. After surgery you will go to a recovery room, and then to a medical/surgical inpatient unit.
-	Foo	od:
	0	Immediately after surgery, you will not eat or drink anything by mouth (also known as NPO).
	0	Starting the day after surgery, you will be allowed to drink clear fluids.
	0	Once you can tolerate a liquid diet, your surgical team will put you on a low fiber diet. Timing will depend on
		your progress, and may correspond to your ability to pass gas or have a bowel movement.
-	Wo	ound/Tubes:
	0	While you are not eating or drinking, you will receive fluids and medications via an intravenous (IV) catheter.
	0	The old ileostomy site will have a dressing in place and it will need to be changed every day. This can be
		taught to you or a family member/caregiver to continue at home or visiting nurse services can be arranged
		by the social worker.
-	Pai	n Management:
	0	Immediately after surgery, you will receive IV pain medication.
	0	Once you are able to tolerate food, you will be given oral pain pills.
-	Act	tivity:
	0	Getting out of bed
		 You will be expected to get out of bed with assistance approximately 6 hours after surgery.
		 You should try and do this at least 3 times a day, increasing your activity as your pain improves.
		 The more you are active, the faster your overall recovery will be.
	0	Breathing exercises
		 You will perform breathing exercises using an incentive spirometer at least 10 times an hour while awake. This will prevent complications, such as pneumonia.
Yo	u ar	e ready for discharge when:
		Your vital signs are stable, including blood pressure, heart rate and temperature.

****Once you have met the discharge criteria, your surgeon or his/her care team will let you know that you are ready for discharge. Discharge may be as early as 10 am****
